Habitat

Native plants provide birds with the four food groups: insects, berries, seeds, and nectar. Feeders can supplement.

Birds need clean drinking water, as well as water for bathing, cooling, and maintaining their feathers all year long. Birds need shelter for nesting, protection from the weather, and hiding spots for both predators and prey. Birds use natural and human-made materials to build their nests. They need a protected place to nest and raise their young.

All you need for an Audubon-recognized Bird-Friendly Habitat! Now, spread the word to neighbors, friends, and colleagues!

Check off at least **two** sources of food and at least **one** source each of water, shelter, and nesting site:
